

The Economy:

Mud Futures Down, Thatch is Through the Roof, Wattle and Dung Stay Insulated

The king's quest for the holy grain is having an impact on the market. Mud Futures for the Kingdom 500 were up 2.25 points, that's 1.59 points above fair value, to 1,768.25. However, Thatch futures 16 points, 7.22 points above fair value, to 15,716. Futures for crockery were up 2 points, .76 points above fair value, to 3,362.5.

French stock markets are trading mostly lower on Tuesday, spurred by weakness in the cow and mime sectors, as the Elderberry index fell .5 percent to 321.83, retreating from its highest closing level since May of 931 A.D.

The Wattle, Dung & Co. stock price remains insulated from recent events in the kingdom, starting out strong, hitting a high price per share of over 50 shillings in its initial public offering, but has cooled down since, closing Monday at 42.90 with trading volume only 1/10th of what it was when it debuted three sessions ago.

Gold hit a 3-1/2 week high today, rising for a fourth straight session as the King has taken all the gold in the land to fund his quest for the holy grail. Remarkably, he still hasn't bought himself a horse.


Dan Maurer Producer, Sound Design


M. Kitty Getlik Lighting Designer








Justin Derry Sir Robin

Liz lives in Groveville with the horn player, and is enjoying singing from the wings.




Jennifer Weiner Supplemental Vocalist
